








### Rare Diseases in Latin America

According to the World Health Organization (WHO):

There are more than **7,000 'rare diseases'**, which is a large amount **that makes at least 7% of the population suffer from at least one of them.** 

This meansthat there are more than 43 million cases in Latin America.

(Latin America's population is approx. 626, 657,000)

### Challenges

- 1. Early diagnosis and timely action
- 2. Knowledge about Rare Diseases
- 3. Obstruction of access
- 4. Establish legal frameworks
- 5. Fragmentation of health services
- 6. Lack of trustworthy statistics



### **Actions required**

Rare diseases go through a series of deficiencies in all levels:

- 1. Coverage
- 2. Early diagnosis
- 3. Long waiting processes for the approval of medicines
- 4. Indefinite buying processes
- 5. Distribution
- 6. Reduced costs in the chain



### **Actions required**

We want our health systems to be sustainable.

We need for committees of joint purchase to allow lower prices and reduce inequity.

It is time to apply those principles of equality and consistently implement and guarantee the patients the right to live by respecting their right to have health.
